A legendary wine. 1961 was the last year when Chateau Latour was still in hands of the original owning family, the Ségurs. The vintage was challenging and the majority of fruit was lost to poor fruit-set and late frost. This lead to a smaller than usual harvest and concentration in the fruit. Upon release, the renowned Bordeaux expert, Edmund Penning-Rowsell, believed Latour to be the wine of the 1961 vintage. Below are a list of other wine critics who have agreed through the years.

As the years go by, this percentage changes, and once lesser known grapes become more vogue. This movement have been coined the “Seven % Solution”.
